

# Firewood Policy

Duluth Indian Point Campground is working to protect Minnesota forests from invasive pests such as the Emerald Ash Borer. As part of this effort, we have implemented a policy prohibiting visitors from bringing firewood from unapproved sources into Duluth Indian Point Campground. Similar programs have been implemented on a state and federal level.

Firewood options available to campground patrons include:

1. Firewood for use at Indian Point Campground facilities may be purchased at the campground store during regular operating hours.
2. Visitors may bring firewood purchased from an approved DNR firewood vendor within 100 miles of the campground property\*. A receipt must accompany firewood to verify the purchase location. 3. Firewood that is kiln-dried, untreated, unpainted, and unstained dimensional lumber (such as 2x4 or 4x6 scraps from a building project) free of metal or other foreign substances.
4. Pallet wood is not approved firewood.

\*The Minnesota Department of Agriculture has placed a quarantine on all ash tree material (including limbs and branches, stumps and roots, logs, lumber, and wood or bark chips), as well as firewood of any hardwood species in Hennepin, Ramsey, and Houston counties. Regulated materials may not be moved out of the three counties noted above. For more information visit :
